# Field Trip Drivers Wanted in October!

Field trips are a FUN way to take a break from your routine, get to know teachers and students, spend time with your child, and fulfill some of your volunteer hours! We need YOU! Please get certified to drive.

All APA field trip drivers must <u>submit</u> the following paperwork in order to drive our students:

A current copy of your driver's license

A current copy of car insurance card - the one you carry in your car (must be updated before each activity)

A current auto insurance declaration page (\$150,000 per occurrence minimum or 100/300k policy)

Fill out the Employee/Volunteer Driver Acknowledgement form (available at the front office)

Review the "Booster Seat Flyer" (available at the front office)

View the Driver Safety Video and submit copy of passed test certificate (EVERY 2 YEARS).

#### All APA Driver Chaperones agree to the following guidelines:

Younger siblings may not attend the field trip if you are driving a group of APA students.

No additional stops may be taken on the way to and from the field trip (drive-thru, gas station, etc.).

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Driver chaperones must bring their own lunch (rather than purchasing at the destination) so that they can stay with the group.

All students must have their own working seatbelt.

Students under age 8 or less than 57 inches tall are required to have a booster seat per Utah Booster Seat Law. Students may not be transported in vans that hold more than 10 passengers.

Driver chaperones may not be alone with any single student.

Driver chaperones must be available to stay with their group for the entire field trip.

A week before each field trip, drivers need to verify that their documentation is still current.

### **School Lunch**

We are continuing our online school lunch program this year. Please place orders prior to 10:00 pm the night before you would like your lunch.

If you have an account, you may order lunches immediately. Please be aware that you will need to update your student's grade and elementary teacher, if you have not already done so. This will ensure that your elementary student's lunch is delivered to the correct classroom.

If you do not currently have an account, you will need to set one up to order school lunches.

#### To set up your student's account:

- 1. You will need to have a current email account. If you do not have an email you can go to gmail.com and create a free gmail account.
- 2. To set up a lunch account, go to <a href="http://utahsmartlunches.com">http://utahsmartlunches.com</a>.
- 3. Click on "Create an account".
- 4. Fill in Account Information and click on "Register".
- 5. Next you will click on "Student". In the last name space you must put in your student's last name, a space, and then your student's school ID#. Example: Smith 3852 (If you do not have the student ID#, just add the last name and I will add the ID#.) Note: student ID# is not their carpool#.
- 6. Add each student going to APA.
- 7. You are now ready to place your order.

If you have not yet returned your Applications for Free/Reduced Lunches, please do so as soon as possible. You are welcome to scan the application and email it to <a href="mwood@apamail.org">mwood@apamail.org</a> or print it and drop it off at the main office. Each family needs to return an application even if you know you do not qualify. Having all of the applications back will help us get needed grants for our school. If you do not qualify, please fill out the following:

1. Your student's name and grade



- 2. Your family name
- 3. Cross out the income section
- 4. Sign the signature line.

If you would like to order milk for your child to drink during lunch, please fill out a form and return it along with your payment to the front office. Please be aware that if you order a school lunch, milk is included with the lunch.

Reading University (RU) is an academic program that introduces students to value-based literature and informational texts and increases vocabulary through independent reading. The goal of the Reading University program is to instill a love for independent reading in each of our students. Reading University is our independent reading program. Students should have a gray folder in their dockets. Inside of that gray folder should be an RU reading log. Students keep track of the books they read and parents sign that the students have read the books. Each grade has a certain number of books to be read each term. Check the learning plan for number of books and due dates. Students may read books one grade level below and any on and above. Each term, students may read one book that is not on the RU list.
