March Builder Theme: I am a Builder When I Quickly Acknowledge Mistakes and Humbly Make Amends

When we recognize we have made a mistake, our first response is often FEAR and SHAME. Fear that others will find out, and that embarrassment will follow. Fear of others being angry or disappointed with us. Fear of consequences. Shame because we have acted beneath our understanding of how we should

have acted. Or shame even if we acted innocently, but realize the mistake was still made. This fear and shame sometimes leads us to think it would be best to HIDE our mistake, or cover it up. Covering or hiding leads to more problems and bad feelings.

It is best to quickly acknowledge our mistake and our feelings.

Grades K-6: Academic Update - Promotion Policy:

It has been a great 4th term at American Prep! Thank you for sharing your wonderful students with us. We appreciate having you as part of our American Prep family.

At this time each year, as we begin re-enrollment, we carefully look at all the progress being made by **EACH** student. During PTC you were able to make plans and set goals with your students' teachers to ensure that each student is on grade level before the end of the year.

Benchmarks and promotional guidelines for each grade are set in place to help us determine the success of a student from year to year.

Students must meet minimum criteria for promotion each year. Teachers may automatically recommend a student for promotion only if the student meets the following criteria:

- 1. Student passed all subjects three terms of the year with at least a C grade.
- 2. Student attended school a minimum of 160 days (less than 21 absences).
- 3. Student passed at least the lowest level of the skills classes reading and mathematics for their grade level, and scored proficient for their grade level on the state end-of-level ②assessment.
- 4. Student has not been suspended during the school year. 2

*Teachers may not recommend for promotion any student who does not meet the above criteria.

The Student Promotion Advisory board, comprised of the student's teacher(s) and school administration, will review all relevant documentation (for each student not recommended for promotion) regarding the student's performance, including but not limited to: grades, attendance, academic achievement records including assessments, work product, and Learning Plans. The Student Promotion Advisory Board will make a determination if the student qualifies for promotion to the next grade.

If your student does not meet the promotion policy, you will be contacted by administration after completing your student's online registration to meet and discuss your student's progress and determine a plan to most help your student find academic success.
