By turning off your car engine when waiting in a school drop-off zone, you will:

SAVE MONEY by reducing fuel use

BREATHE EASIER by preventing unhealthy exhaust from building up around your car

PROTECT OUR BLUE SKY by reducing emissions that contribute to smog

The Draper City Council adopted Resolution #19-34, the Draper City Clean Air Initiative. The council acknowledges idling vehicles emit particulate matter that when inhaled may cause serious health conditions. The city is committed to helping improve the air in Draper and will work with the State of Utah and other cities to reduce vehicle emissions.

The Resolution encourages Draper residents to not idle their engines on public or private property if they are waiting more than two minutes, except in extenuating situations where health and safety are a concern.

Shut off your engine and BE IDLE FREE!

Just 10 seconds of idling uses more fuel than restarting your car!

Did you know? 53% of emissions going into our air are from mobile sources, most of which are personal vehicles.
