

Brand and Logo Guidelines

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Primary Logo



AMERICAN PREPARATORY ACADEMY

The primary logo for American Preparatory Academy has two elements: the APA star in the signature APA red and the text "American Preparatory Academy" featured in our primary font, Minion Variable Concept, in APA Navy Blue. When using the logo, ensure that is high resolution so that is does not appear pixelated.

Safe Area

This logo should be used above any other if possible and should be placed on top of a white background. It should be given a "safe area" of white space surrounding the logo as not to crowd the logo and so it can be easily read and recognized.

The safe area should be equal to the height of the text "ACADEMY" and should be surrounding the entire perimeter of the logo in a rectangular shape. No other elements such as typography, other logos or graphics should intrude the safe area.

Acceptable Variations

The original colored logo, with the star on top and centered, should be used whenever possible to maintain cohesive branding. There may be a few occasions when a variance is acceptable, when the primary logo will not fit properly.

Below are few options of variations in design all of which have the two main elements, the signature APA star and our school name in the appropriate font.







Acceptable color variations are as follows. A one-color variation is acceptable in white only if using the logo on a dark background.




0.31 Acceptable Variations

The star should ONLY appear in red or white and should not deviate from these colors. Blue is an acceptable coordinating color but the star itself should never be printed in blue. In very rare instances, the star can be printed in silver. It can also stand alone, but only when being used in situations where the APA brand is very well known such as inside the school.




To ensure consistency, do not alter the APA logos. Do not distort the logo. Do not change the color of the logo. Do not cover, fill or add texture to the logo. It should not be printed in gray, as a screened value, or semitransparent. It should not be used as a decorative border or background.



Color Palette

APA, being a patriotic school, is represented by three main colors, red, white and blue. APA red is defined as Pantone 54-16. This color should mainly be used as a highlighting or accenting color. APA blue is defined as a navy blue, Pantone 282 and is used most commonly as the primary color at APA.



Blind embossing, use of die cuts or stamping in silver foil is also acceptable use of APA symbols or logos.

Accent colors should be complementary and subordinate to the blue and red. It is strongly discouraged for designs to use colors such as purple or orange and non-coordinating colors should be avoided to reduce confusion.

When designing materials or artwork, please be sure to check the pantone, CMYK, RGB to assure accuracy.

0.4 Color Palette

Text and Font

The American Preparatory Academy name should be used as the full name whenever possible. However, in certain circumstances, American Prep is used and is considered the next best name. When space is limited and/or the brand is well known, APA will suffice.

Nonconforming Identity Marks

Nonconforming identity marks are strongly encouraged to transition to the new updated guidelines. No new designs that differ from the accepted secondary logos should have been used or created. Merchandise should not be a primary color outside of the supporting color genres of APA's approved colors.



Clubs or staff may not alter the logo to fit their desires.

Parents or teachers may not use the logo to make financial gain that does not directly return to the schools.

Other Logos

The American Preparatory Academy crest is used to represent the school's three pillars of success. Specifically, when representing our higher education grades and in such circumstances as official certificates, graduation diplomas, formal reports and scholarly papers.

The seal should not be used on letterhead or related printed materials such as brochures, business cards, envelopes or mailing packets.

The crest may also be used in situations calling for permanent identifying marks for the school such as architectural elements produced in glass or stone or metal.
