OCTOBER BUILDER THEME: "I Am A Builder When I Am Perfectly Honest!"

Our students are focusing on being perfectly honest this month. The reason we use the phrase "perfectly honest" is because in our world there is often a message sent that there is such a thing as "pretty honest" or "honest enough". We encourage you to discuss this at home to help your students understand the difference. There are few values needed more in this life than honesty and consequent trust that comes from it. These tips can help you teach your children how to be honest in their daily lives.

Talk about how much you value honesty in your family. Discuss how important it is to every family member to always count on each other to tell the truth-even when it's difficult. If there's not honesty, there won't be closeness in your family. Focus on how honesty is the foundation upon which your mutual trust and respect are built. Each family member supports and defends each other, but dishonesty will change the nature of your relationship dramatically. Once trust is broken, it takes a long time to build it back.


Place more emphasis on their truthfulness than on the consequence for their dishonesty. Of course you should impose consequences for dishonesty, but emphasize that everyone makes mistakes that bring consequences, but consequences increase when dishonesty is discovered, because trust will be broken. No matter what your child does, first and foremost, acknowledge and praise their honesty. Help and support your student practice perfect honestly, so they will not be afraid to tell the truth.

Honesty is a life-long quest and something we have to work on all of the time, not just when we are children. Please use this opportunity to discuss how much you value integrity in your family. Tell them how proud you are that they are demonstrating honesty.



DROP OFF/PICK UP REMINDERS

• DO PULL ALL THE WAY FORWARD AT THE CURB.

Right when you get to the curb, isn't always the best time for your student to exit the vehicle. Please pull ALL the way forward before letting your student exit. This is a tremendous help, in keeping traffic moving.

• DO NOT-GET OUT OF THE CAR AT THE CURB.

Make sure the learning plan is signed well before you get to the curb and please be sure to say your goodbyes as you approach the curb. This will help in a speedy exit from the vehicle. If these things aren't done, please park to get them taken care of.

• DO NOT-USE THE NEIGHBORHOOD OR COMMERCIAL BUSINESSES TO TURN AROUND.

Just plan your arrival route from 114th and departure to 123rd.

There should be NO cutting through the neighborhood from where Bob is standing and the next two blocks.

• DO-MERGE INTO THE RIGHT LANE APPROACHING THE SCHOOL SAFELY & WELL BEFORE THE ENTRY.

Be courteous to others.

• DO-USE MOBILE DEVICES ONLY WHEN PARKED- NOT while moving.

Staff will ask you to put the phone down while you are moving. YOUR student is out there too.

• DO NOT-PARK AND WALK THE CURB TO SEARCH FOR YOUR STUDENT.

The only people on any curb should be students and staff ONLY. This is a safety concern and there are NO exceptions!

• DO NOT-USE THE FIRE LANE (MIDDLE LANE) AT ANY TIME OF DAY FOR ANY REASON.


This lane is NOT to be used by any staff or students. Please keep this lane clear at all times.

• DO NOT-MAKE A U TURN! ANYWHERE REALLY, BUT ESPECIALLY IN THE "NO U TURN ZONE" SHOWN BELOW.

PLEASE follow the correct lane instructions to get to your curb safely and to ensure others can get to their curb safely.

• DO NOT-PARK IN A NUMBERED PARKING SPOT

The numbered parking spots are assigned parking for staff members. Please look for a "Visitor" parking spot.
