Veterans Day

This year marks our 10th anniversary holding Veterans Day assemblies! There is a lot of preparation that goes into these events, and we thought we'd share some of that with you so you can talk with your student about this important event!



Our students have been busy writing thank you letters to veterans. These letters are in the shape of stars, written on white paper and glued to a blue or red construction paper star. We then affix a special-made pin to each letter, and this is the gift we give each Veteran that attends our assembly. This year our pin looks like this:



Our students are also busy learning songs and poems that they will perform at the assembly. Each elementary grade level performs a song or a poem, and the messages of love and respect to our Veterans can be felt by everyone in attendance!

We would love all our parents to be able to attend these events, but there is not enough room in our gymnasiums for that to be possible. Parents who bring a Veteran to be honored will have a seat. Most campuses have 50-80 Veterans guests, so our space fills up and we don't have room for additional guests. Because we really want all of our parents to see this great assembly, we have arranged to have the event "live-streamed" on KSL. You can watch on your computer at live.ksl.com and we hope parents who can will tune in! Our assemblies will be November 8th at 9:00 am and 12:00 Noon. Your student's teacher will be emailing you which assembly your student will be attending. The program will be about an hour long - depending upon how many veterans attend each assembly.

Get involved with Girls on the Run! Volunteer Coaches Needed!What is Girls on the Run?

Girls on the Run is a program for girls in 3rd-5th grade that encourages girls to recognize their individual strengths and celebrate connections with others. Each season, girls gain a better understanding of who they are and what's important to them, the value of teamwork and healthy relationships and how they can have a positive impact on the world. Girls also make a meaningful contribution to their community through a team-organized Community Impact Project. Physical activity is woven into the program to inspire an appreciation for fitness and healthy habits and teach life skills including treating others with care, practicing gratitude and managing emotions. Each season culminates with a Girls on the Run 5k event. This celebratory, non-competitive event provides girls with a sense of accomplishment and instills the value of goal setting at a young age.



Why get involved?

As a coach you will have the opportunity to inspire young girls to be joyful, healthy and confident by using a fun, experience-based curriculum which creatively integrates running. All coaches are trained and are provided with all the materials needed to successfully run the program.

Girls face social pressures and conflicting messages about how they should act and who they should be. Studies show that by adolescence, girls' confidence drops about twice as much as boys'. Friendships become more complicated and challenging, girls' perception of their academic ability declines, the likelihood of anxiety and depression increases and participation in physical activity plummets.

It doesn't have to be this way.

We believe that every girl is inherently full of power and potential. By knowing they are the leaders of their lives, these are the girls who will change the world.

Who can volunteer?

We are looking for Head Coaches, Assistant Coaches, Jr. Coaches and Running buddies. Anyone over the age of 16 can volunteer. We need teachers, parents, aunts, uncles, brothers and sisters.

When is it?

The program is held for 2 hours a week. It can be twice a week for 1 hour or once a week for 2 hours. This can be arranged and decided by the Head Coach and school. (In the past it has been held on Thursdays from 2:30-4:30) The program will start the week of March 12^{th} and ends with the 5K on June 2^{nd} .
