Hot Air Balloon at Draper 2!

Students were surprised with an exciting outside STEM lesson before Fall Break. Chick-fil-A graciously brought and inflated a hot-air balloon where students could see up close how a hot-air balloon is set up and learn about the science of its operation. Many students had the opportunity to touch the balloon, and some even got to participate in prepping the balloon for inflation.
