Academic Support Team - Volunteers Needed

Teachers are responsible to organize the parents of students in their classrooms into Academic Support Teams (AST) Team Leaders for each need to be identified by the teacher. These volunteers will work with the teacher, in and out of the classroom.

AST members will provide support to the teacher in the following ways:

Families with students attending D2 & D3

We love that so many families are choosing to continue receiving their education at the D3 campus. A reminder for carpool pick up...families need to first pick up JH and HS students at Draper 3 and then make a second stop at the Draper 2 campus for elementary students. Please do not send your JH or HS Draper 3 student to the Draper 2 campus to pick up their sibling. We also ask that you do not instruct your Draper 2 elementary student to walk over to Draper 3 to hang out or get picked up. This is for the safety of the students.

Uniform Reminders

Casual Friday continues for another year! Students in grades K-6 may wear khaki pants with solid navy polo-style shirts on Fridays. Shoes remain the same style as Monday-Thursday.

Additional Clarifications: Following are some uniform notes that we feel need clarification:

- Shoes must be solid black in color with no embellishments or visible patterns. Students may wear black athletic or dress shoes.
- A bow tie is an option for boys in grades 4-6 in the APA plaid or stripe.
- White polo shirts are only part of the K-3 uniform. 4th-6th grade students must wear the uniform appropriate blouse or shirt, not a white polo.
- In K-3, girls may wear either a white polo or blouse under their jumpers. K-3 boys may wear a white polo with a navy sweater/vest or a navy blue polo.
- Skirts & jumpers must come to the knee or longer.
- Khaki pants/shorts must be uniform style dress pants/shorts. They should be loose (able to pinch an inch of loose fabric.) Peg leg, skinny, or tight-fitting pants, cargo, or jean style pants are not uniform appropriate. No outside pockets.

If a student is out of uniform they may be sent to the office to call home. Students will not be allowed in class without the proper uniform.

Spirit Wear Friday - Friday, September 1

Students and staff can show their American Prep spirit the first Friday of every month by wearing Spirit Wear items on top, and regular Friday dress on bottom. Drop Off/Pick Up (aka Carpool)

We appreciate everyone's patience and understanding as families and staff are learning the drop off and pick up procedures. This time of day is a perfect opportunity to demonstrate to your children and APA neighbors on how to be a builder. A few reminders:

- 1. Display your carpool tag on the rearview mirror. If it is on the dash or seat next to you it is difficult for our staff to see and allow your vehicle on the property.
- 2. Instruct your child(ren) to enter and exit the vehicle on the side nearest the curb. This is for your child's safety as well as keeping the flow of traffic moving.
- 3. Please do not walk your child inside the building when dropping them off. There are plenty of staff members ready to greet your child and help them to the correct spot, if needed.

- 4. If you have business to conduct inside the school, park in a visitor parking space. If you park in a numbered stall, you are taking a spot that belongs to a staff member and delaying them from entering the building and beginning their job (helping your student have a successful day)!
- 5. If you do not live in the neighborhood directly North of APA, this is NOT a place for APA traffic. Please be courteous and do not use the neighborhood to turn around and/or use as a staging area until your pick up time.

School Safety

Our first fire drill of the year will be held Thursday, August 24th. We will have monthly fire drills as well as occasional lockdown and evacuation drills. We do all we can to keep APA a safe environment for all students, but we request your help. If you or your student(s) know of anything happening against school rules, we ask that you let us know immediately. We appreciate the entire APA community helping to make this a great place!

Visiting American Prep

Please remember that anytime you need to come to school; even if it is to deliver a lunch or a docket; you must stop by the office to sign in and get a visitor's badge. You will be asked to return to the office if you are not wearing a visitor badge. We have quite a few new staff members who would not know if you are a parent to one of our students or someone dangerous. Please help us keep all of our students and staff safe.

K-3 should read this part at tryouts:

PREAMBLE

We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defence, promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.

4-6 should read this part at tryouts:

SECTION 6

The Senators and Representatives shall receive a Compensation for their Services, to be ascertained by Law, and paid out of the Treasury of the United States. They shall in all Cases, except Treason, Felony and Breach of the Peace, be privileged from Arrest during their Attendance at the Session of their respective Houses, and in going to and returning from the same; and for any Speech or Debate in either House, they shall not be questioned in any

other Place.

No Senator or Representative shall, during the Time for which he was elected, be appointed to any civil Office under the Authority of the United States, which shall have been created, or the Emoluments whereof shall have been increased during such time; and no Person holding any Office under the United States, shall be a Member of either House during his Continuance in Office.

Compliance Items

Professional Qualifications

Our parent surveys consistently express confidence and overwhelming satisfaction with our teachers at American Prep. In accordance with state regulation, all APA teachers are licensed through one of three licensing paths: Professional, Associates and LEA specific. Parents are welcome at any time to request information regarding the professional qualifications of the student's classroom teachers including: 1) whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction or whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived; 2) the baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree; and 3) whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

District Parent and Family Engagement Policy

American Prep recognizes that parent and family engagement is key to student achievement. We provide many opportunities for parents and family members to participate in, and stay informed of, their student's academic achievement.

American Preparatory Academy trains staff annually during pre-service and teacher academy on how to communicate, build meaningful connections, and otherwise involve parents/families and the school. Summative assessments allow for data to be used in public reporting about school quality. Parent's may opt-out of most state standardized tests by submitting a Parental Exclusion form to the Academic Director.
